Life is full of happiness, Still it has some darkness, Should I love it or live it, I am yet to know.


The sky is infinite, Life is definite, Should I dream or win, I am yet to know.


DECONSTRUCTING

An online workshop was conducted for the students of 4th year to help them work on their concepts for their housing project of Semester VII.




DAY 2:





Existing Plan
Vancouver, Canada

Multi-level laneway homes are the most common offering in Vancouver, largely due to their minimal footprint in the backyard. It becomes a contemporary expansion to the traditional house

The existing laneway house is home to a living room with a kitchen area and a bedroom with a bathroom. But as families grow, the need for space grows together. The three proposed spaces, welcoming and functional acts as extensions of the existing laneway house.

Construction

The truck can contain only 13' x 25' wide room sizes. Considering this, the wall panels are designed, these precast panels can be manufactured in the factory and can be easily transported from the factory to the site.



The Extension Modules

Scenario 1

The first extension module of size 17' x 17' is placed over the bedroom area. This unit can work as an office space. the skylight provided over the living space provides beautiful views and plenty of sunlight. It is slightly sloped which helps with the Canadian weather.


Scenario 2

The second extension module of size 23' x 20' is placed over the part living area, part bedroom and over kitchen and bathroom. This extension contains an office area, a bedroom and a bathroom. Windows that follow similar patterns of the floor below provide views of the backyard.


Scenario 3

In third extension, the living room is extended from 2 sides by 4'. The upper module of size 12' x 17' is over the living area with a dog-legged staircase leading above. It can be used as a guest house or as kids bedroom room. Inside a day bed with work unit to maximize space. Windows provide views of the backyard and the laneway.

The texture of high-quality wood materials - Western Red Cedar and Douglas Fir wood provide a richness that greatly enhances the



The natural wood panels are used as the façade materials. The Douglas fir wood panels are bright and reflect light and rightly contrasts with the Western Red Cedar wood panelling. This helps in maintaining the architectural expression of the house.



Equitone linea is a unique 3D shaped, through-coloured facade material that plays with light and shadow.

It displays a linear texture that highlights the raw inner texture of the core fibre cement material.

The changing angle of the daylight gives the facade material a different aspect.

The fiber cement material comes in a large panel sizes of 2500 x 1220 mm and 3050 x 1220 mm and can be cut into any size or shape in a workshop or on-site.




Double Twist Columns

One of the most important examples of nature's influence on the architecture can be seen at the Sagrada Familia and is one of Gaudí's main discoveries, the double twist column.

In nature, this double twist geometric shape can be found in some plant species, like the oleander (Nerium oleander) and the abelia (Abelia chinensis).

Seeking out the sun, from the space left between the leaves, the interior of the branches, twist in a helicoidal fashion to feed the leaves on each level.

If you cut off a branch, you can see two of the geometric shapes that are behind this column: the equilateral triangle and the hexagon. The latter is created by twisting an equilateral triangle, according to the laws of the double twist column.



Applicaton:

This is exactly the design Gaudí used to improve the support of the inclined columns on the narthex of the Passion façade, which have very wide bases to help support and better transfer the inclined forces down to the foundations.




Council reveal: 18th August
